**ARTISTS' TO OPEN** new exhibit, *Speed Limits*, Friday at the University of Florida. The exhibit explores the role of art in modern life and celebrates the 100th anniversary of Futurism. In 1909, the Foundation and Festival of Futurism aimed that "the world's intelligence has been enriched by new beauty: the beauty of speed." The tempo of life continues to accelerate, now, 100 years later, the exhibit asks questions about the impact of speed on the lives of human beings.

The exhibit will be on view through Feb. 20 and is co-organized by the Wolfsonian and the Canadian Centre for Architecture (CCA). Its curator is **Jeffrey T. Schnapp**, a CAA Mellon senior fellow and professor at Stanford

University. There are more than 200 works from the collections of The Wolfsonian and the CCA and features a variety of media, including posters, books, drawings, clocks, paintings and videos in *Speed Limits*. The Wolfsonian is at 1001 Washington Ave. in Miami Beach. Admission is \$7 for adults and \$5 for seniors and students. Wolfsonian members, State University System of Florida staff and students with ID, and children under 6 are admitted free.
